JOB TITLE: Registered Nurse – Systemic Therapy/Transfusion (**Temporary Part-Time**)

Function Summary:

As a member of the interdisciplinary team, the role of Registered Nurse (RN) at CCH is to deliver safe, effective, patient-centered, ethical, and evidenced-based nursing care. The overall function of the RN is to assist our patients and community to manage clinical conditions and transitions and maximise their self-care abilities. The RN also acts as a resource for members of the care team.

DUTIES: Reporting to the Manager of Ambulatory Clinics, the RN will be responsible for the assessment and management (planning and providing) for the chemotherapy outpatient as part of the Medical Day Care Unit. Additionally the R.N. will be accountable for assessing the learning needs of the client and their family, working closely with the clinical leadership at The Ottawa Hospital, to deliver the teaching, individually or in a group setting.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Required

- Holds current Certificate of Competence from the College of Nurses of Ontario
- Minimum three (3) years general nursing experience with two (2) years recent oncology experience
- Theoretical knowledge of the care of patients with oncological diagnosis and related medical illness/disease, and ability to apply this knowledge in a clinical setting
- Commitment to personal continuing education activities, including self-evaluation
- DeSouza Certification (Oncology Chemotherapy Biotherapy certificate)
- Superior assessment skills and knowledge of interventions related to oncological symptom management and emergencies
- Demonstrates ability and application of knowledge related to Central Venous Access Devices (CVAD), including care and maintenance.
- Demonstrates leadership skills and abilities
- Knowledge of Quality Improvement
- Demonstrated commitment to patient safety
- Good attendance and work record
- Ability to meet the physical demands of the position
- Functional level in both official languages (oral and written in English; oral in French – and testing completed)
